#### 1 Review of performance (Quarter 3, 2016 vs Quarter 3, 2015)

For the third quarter ended 30 September 2016, the Group recorded a turnover increase of 3.7% (+RM45 million) compared to Q3 2015. The domestic business (+3.5%) as well as the Export business (+4.5%) contributed to this overall growth. Within the 3rd quarter, the Group continued its innovation and renovation drive by launching successfully many new products such as NESTLÉ Bliss Go, NESTUM Banana Caramel, NESCAFÉ Tarik Ready-to-Drink and MAGGI Oatmee.

From profit perspective, Gross Profit increased from RM461 million to RM491 million, a growth of 6.5%. Main drivers for the improved Gross Profit were the higher turnover as well as efficiency increases in the factories and the supply chain. These savings were reinvested into the business by supporting the new products as well as by intensifying our Trade-and Consumer promotions in order to continue to strengthen our market share position as the base for a sustainable growth. As a result, the Operating Profit and the Net Profit reduced compared to the corresponding period in 2015.

#### 2 Review of performance (Year-to-date, 2016 vs Year-to-date, 2015)

For the first nine months ended 30 September 2016, the Group registered a turnover of RM 3.8 billion, 4.8% higher than the previous year's corresponding period. This solid performance was supported by higher domestic sales and a strong growth in the Export business. The growth in the domestic business was driven by the continuous innovation and renovation initiatives as well as by successful Trade and-Consumer promotions.

The Gross Profit rose by 9.6% driven by the higher turnover, favourable commodity prices as well as efficiency increases in the factories and in the overall supply chain. These savings were partially re-invested in Trade-and Consumer promotion activities in order to fuel the growth. This balanced business approach has enabled the Group to continue registering good growth in the operating profit (RM 708 million), 12.1% higher than the same period last year.

As a result and in addition to a lower effective tax rate, the profit after tax increased from RM 491 million to RM 570 million, representing an improvement of 16.1%.

#### 3 Variation of results against previous quarter (Quarter 3, 2016 vs. Quarter 2, 2016)

In the third quarter of 2016, the Group registered a turnover of RM1.3 billion, 2.1% higher than the previous quarter. The lower net profit in comparison to the prior quarter was mainly due to the higher input cost and intense marketing and promotional activies in the third quarter.

#### 4 Current year prospects

Based on our cautiously optimistic outlook for the Malaysian economy, we will continue with our "Fuel the Growth" strategy: Striving for efficiency increases all over the supply chain and reinvesting the realized improvements into the sustainable growth of the Company by innovating / renovating our portfolio and intensifying our Trade-and Consumer promotions.
